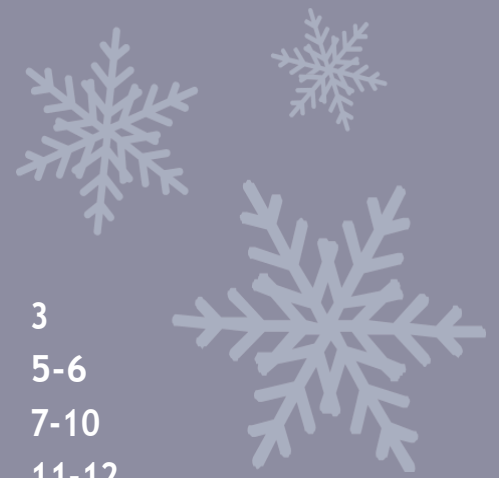

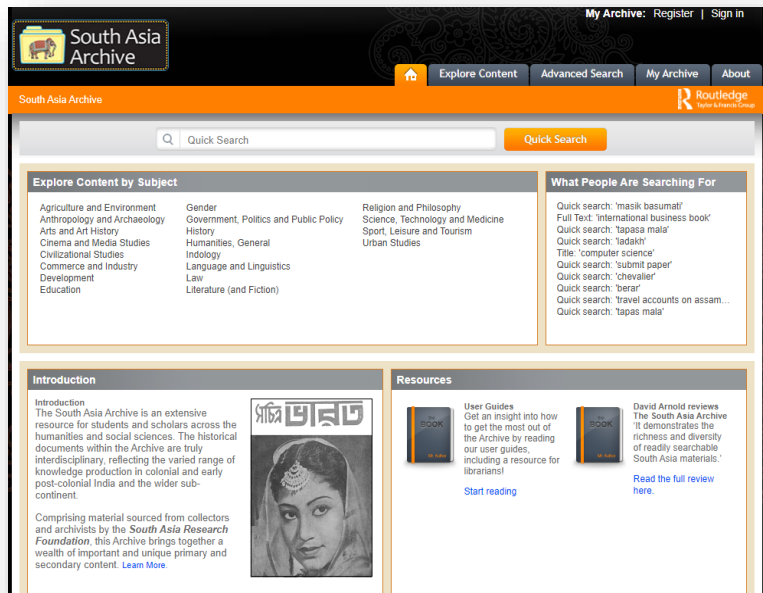

Membership & E-Resource Access

In addition, the Central Library is a member in the illustrious DELNET. It has been founded with the primary purpose of fostering resource sharing among the libraries through the establishment of a network of libraries, which is the primary mission of the organisation. It strives to gather, preserve, and distribute information in addition to providing users with computerised services, coordinate efforts for appropriate collection growth, and, if feasible, minimise needless duplication.

The Central Library now has access to the South Asia Archive, which offers online access to millions of pages of rare primary and secondary materials across the social sciences and the humanities. This database became available at the beginning of this academic year. The South Asia Archive is a genuinely multidisciplinary resource that spans the Humanities and Social Sciences. It covers topics as diverse as economics, politics, and anthropology, as well as cultural studies, history, education, and literature. Due to the extensive collection of content, investigation and study may be conducted across all of the various topics.



IEEE Computer Society Digital Library



The IEEE Xplore digital library is a powerful resource for discovery of scientific and technical content published by the IEEE (Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers) and its publishing partners. IEEE Xplore provides web access to more than five million full-text documents from some of the world's most highly-cited publications in electrical engineering, computer science, and electronics. IIITDM Kurnool subscribed IEEE CSDL for the benefit of the students, research scholars and faculties.

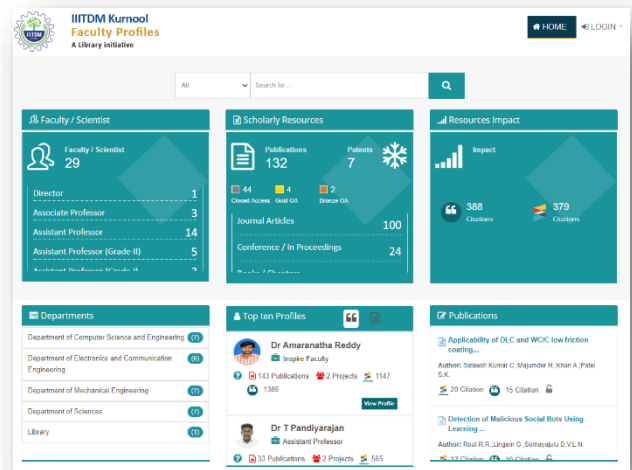
Services

The Central Library provides various user-oriented services and functions as the centre of information of the Institute. Additional services of the library include circulation service which issues books from the library collections and recollection, apart from shelving and arranging books and materials as per the standard norms. New Arrivals, Table of Content Alert and Article Sharing Services are the major alerting services that are offered at the library.



As per the recommendations and guidelines of 'COPE – Committee on Publication Ethics' for promoting integrity in scholarly research and publications, the library provides access to plagiarism software 'OURIGINAL' & Turnitin iThenticate thereby reducing the scope for plagiarism and increasing the quality and originality of the research work being conducted on campus.

Library is also maintaining **IRINS** website of the institute where it facilitates the academic, R&D organizations and faculty members, to collect, curate and showcase the scholarly communication activities and provide an opportunity to create the scholarly network. As per the current publication profile, 56 new research articles, other publication added to the IRINS portal. The current citation of the institute is 388 and 379 from Scopus and CrossRef respectively.



Koha, an open-source library automation programme, is used by the library to manage its collection using barcodes. The Online Public Access Catalogue (Campus-Access only), the fastest and most precise instrument for information retrieval, available to the users to search our catalogue. Additionally, there is free Wi-Fi access provided for patrons within the library.

The Government of India will emphasize making books available extensively in both schools and public libraries to ensure the availability and accessibility of books to all including physical handicaps.
3. Promotion of Reading Habit Across the Country
Both public and school libraries will be extensively enhanced to increase readership across the country. Public libraries have to be strengthened and modernized with the latest technology.
4. Application of ICT in School / Public Libraries in Villages
To serve the user community and the students in better ways particularly in villages during non-school hours, the ICT-equipped school/public libraries will be set up in the next coming years. Book club facilities will be developed to further promote reading habits.
5. Strengthening of Library Collection for the Higher Education Systems
Academic libraries are the hearts of institutions and the government of India will strengthen and increase the procurement of reading materials like books, periodicals, and other learning and teaching materials.
6. Public Library spaces for Adult Education
The Government of India will work on providing suitable infrastructure to ensure adult education and a lifelong learning process for all interested in Education. The public library spaces shall be used for adult education and other activities for community engagement and skill development.

8. Create appropriate continuing education for library staff:

The government will promote acceptable career paths for library staff and ensure appropriate staffing to meet its goal of building, developing, and enhancing existing library facilities and catering to the requirements of all sorts of readers across the country.

The one-man empire of reading

"If your library is fully operational here for more than six months, I will give you a golden ring". Sankara Marar, a munsiff from Ambalappuzha, a village in Kerala, challenged P. N Panicker, a library veteran. However, the patriarch of the library exceeded the expectations of the munsiff by successfully managing the library attached to Sreekrishna Swami Temple, Amplappuzha. The man in this tale establishes an 'empire of reading' in Kerala, which later becomes one of India's most literate states. ^[1]

*Puthuvayil Narayana Panicker is known as the **Father of the Kerala Library Movement** was born in 1909 in Neelampperoor, a small village in Kerala known for the folk dance Padyani. He began his career as a primery school teacher, but his dream world is filled with books and libraries.*

His activities began with mingling people from villages in Ambalappuzha who believed in Gandian ideology, and he later established his first library, the Neelamperoor Santhana Dhramma Library, in 1926. Panicker initiated the Travancore library association in pre-independent India in 1945 at the P K Memorial Library only with roughly 47 rural libraries and laboriously pursued his goal that 'there shouldn't be a single village in Kerala without libraries'. Later, in 1956, by expanding the association to throughout the state with more than 6,000 libraries and renamed as Kerala Granthasala Sangham (KGS). By establishing KGS he has created an impact on excellent literacy and reading movement in the early 1990s. He was a man who, like Prometheus from Greek mythology, travelled among the populace carrying a 'fire of knowledge'. He visited by foot in each cornel village in the state with the slogan 'vaayikkuka valaruka' (read and grow) to raise awareness about strength of literacy and the elegance of reading. ^[2]

"A visionary can see what others don't see" addressed by Shri Ram Nath Kovind, Hon'ble precedent of India during the occasion of unveiling of statue of P.N Panicker. It's interesting that it's a perfectly appropriate description of him given that libraries are the hub of social and cultural activities in each village and have made significant contributions to Kerala's goal of



achieving universal literacy. ^[3] Panicker served as a secretary of KGS for a long duration of 32 years and later state government taken over to made a public department renamed as Kerala State Library Council with funding and democratic structure. His contribution does not stop with the library; he is also a pioneer in the literacy mission known as Non-Formal Education and Development (KANFED). He also made a slogan ‘*Saakshara Keralam; Sunthara Keralam*’ (Literary Kerala; Beautiful Kerala) to achieve universal literacy. ^[4]

In 1975 the *KGS* won UNESCO’s precious ‘*Krupsakaya Award*’. Age 86, Panicker passed away on June 19, 1995 and his death anniversary, June 19th, is commemorating as a *vayanadinam* (reading day) in Kerala, as well as a *vayana varam* (reading week) from June 19th to June 25th. Since 2017, the Hon’ble Prime Minister Sree *Narendramodi* has announced *Kerala* reading day to be National Reading Day. ^[5]

At the tragic conclusion of the tale, due to influences of some political reasons, he was removed from his throne of the empire and quietly hid his contributions.
